## Kingsbridge in Bloom began as a result of an initiative to make the town A better Kingsbridge for All

Our environmental policy is aimed at *working in sympathy with nature, conserving* valuable resources and enhancing the environment and quality of life for people and wildlife alike.

To achieve this, it is necessary to ensure that all those working with us are aware of our environmental guidelines, as follows:

- *To use material resources carefully*, based on the principles of reduce, reuse and recycle.
- *To use water* as efficiently as practicable, using butts for water storage and plant-containers with reservoirs.
- *To manage waste locally* prioritising local composting of all plant material; plus re-use/recycling of pots and plants, wherever possible.
- *To buy locally* with the emphasis on environmentally sensitive products and increased perennial planting.
- *To plant in sympathy with local needs, conditions and climate* native wild-flowers, butterfly and bee-friendly plants, plus sensory and edible plants in public spaces; drought-tolerance is given high priority; salt tolerance where appropriate.
- *To enhance growing conditions,* by using locally produced mulch and conditioner, and *to protect plants* by environmentally sensitive means, such as beer traps and copper tape.
- *To avoid the use of chemicals,* except for control of persistent, invasive weeds.
- *To provide homes for wild-life* hedgehog streets, boxes for birds, bats and insects and to encourage others to do so.
- *To celebrate local history and heritage* and highlight this via displays and signage, acknowledging that much of our heritage (farming, lime production, shipping) is linked to the natural environment.
- *To enhance the locality*, by keeping the town clean, tidy and attractive, working with others to address issues such as litter, graffiti and dog-fouling, and by supporting the use of art in public spaces.
- *To educate others* including children on the natural world and environmental matters, including local history, via activities, leaflets Hedgehog Street/Tranquillity Trail and signage
- *To encourage good practice,* such as home-composting, water-conservation, correct use of brown bins and anti-littering.
- *To consult specialists*, such as the local Natural History Society, to help ensure current best practice.
- *To keep abreast of current environmental guidance* in respect of e.g. growing media and weed-control, and to advise others, including those in local government, of concerns.
- *To review this policy* on a bi-ennial basis next review due2020
